#### **OBSERVER REPORTS**

#### Bowling Green Board of Education meeting June 21, 2016

The meeting started on time and all members were present. There was opportunity for public input but none was given. Given special recognition was Sal Yerra, 2016 Ohio Elementary Girls Chess First Place Champion--outstanding! Sal is a second grader at Crim School. Also recognized were Noah Cook, Nick Lane, and Eric Rine who placed at the High School Track & Field Boys State Championship, and their coaches.

Suuperintendent Francis Scruci gave an overview of the state report on BG school facilities. There will be a public meeting on June 28 at 7:00 p.m. in the Middle School library--this will be the first of several meetings to discuss with the public what to do about facilities needs.

The board approved hiring of teachers for Summer OGT Camp and new teachers for the 2016-2017 school year; extended time for library media specialists, school counselors and school psychologists; supplemental contracts for sports including resignation of Daniel DeWitt as hockey head coach and employment as middle school athletic director; summer stipends for curriculum writing and for training sessions for Words Their Way, both paid from Title IIA funds; employment, resignation, and advancement for support personnel; Other Personnel including em;loyment of Eddie Powers as hockey head coach. The board accepted a gift of 100 used Dell desktop computers from BGSU and an NLL Sportsmanship Banner from the Middle School from Brian Stretchberry. They approved a trip by the high school drama students to London from June 14-19, 2017.

#### Bowling Green Board of Education meeting July 26, 2016

The meeting started on time and all members were present. There was opportunity for public input but none was given. It was reported that the high school football stadium upgrade will be ready for the first game. Dr. Ann McCarty, executive director of teaching and learning, gave a presentation on the school district state report card. Jodi Anderson, coordinator of secondary curriculum, gave a report on STEAM programs available to students. Both reports were excellent. Superintendent Francis Scruci reported on the readiness of buildings for the start of the school year--first day of classes is Monday August 15.

The board approved miscellaneous contracts for teaching personnel and for support personnel; employment of home instruction tutors and Thursday/Friday school monitors for the 2016-17 school year on an as-needed basis; supplemental contracts for sports; stipends for various training and summer work tasks. They approved agreements for special needs students, adopted curriculum for preschool, approved a letter of understanding with St Mark's Lutheran Church for facility usage for BG Preschool for 2016-17 school year, accepted the 2016-17 student fee schedule and a resolution to adopt a calamity day alternative make-up plan, approved a mandatory shut down of all athletics between July 1-July 9, 2017. The board recognized the 1978 graduating class for their gift of a Bobcat statue for the high school.

#### Bowling Green Board of Education meeting August 16, 2016

The meeting started on time and all members were present. Jean was asked to lead the room in the pledge of allegiance. The Showcase Presentation was by Dr. Ann McCarty, executive director of teaching and learning, Jodi Anderson, coordinator of secondary curriculum, and Zeb Kellough, coordinator of elementary curriculum, about efforts at curriculum writing by teachers. Superintendent Francis Scruci talked about efforts to improve teacher orientation. There are 30 new staffers for 2016-17. He also commented about school fundraisers--he thinks there are too many in the community.

The board approved a few contracts involving teaching personnel; approved hiring of auxiliary service/non public allocation federal funds personnel for 2016-17 for St Aloysius School, St Louis School, Montessori School, and BG Christian Academy; approved of payments for mentees and supplemental contracts for mentors for the Resident Educator Mentor Program; approved supplemental contracts for sports and for 5th grade camp; approved employment of support personnel; approved various issues involving other personnel; approved the retirement of Carlton Schooley as director of transportation effective September 27, 2016; accepted gifts; recommended the Strategic Plan, and approved merit pay for the superintendent and treasurer for the contract year ending July 31, 2016.

When I asked the board president Paul Walker, he said that board members do get information ahead of time which makes voting quicker. But it doesn't give the audience a sense of board members' feeling on the various issues when there is not discussion.

#### Bowling Green City Council meeting August 15, 2016

The meeting started 5 minutes late due to a preceeding public meeting. The public meeting was a Council of the Whole meeting to interview applicants for the fourth ward seat vacated by Theresa Charters-Gavarone. Gavarone resigned when she was appointed to fill the seat of Tim Brown as state Representative When the regular Council meeting started, Scott Seeliger was appointed to be the fourth ward representative. Items of interest to League from the meeting: Sandy Rowland said she wants a resolution regarding the "green space" remaining a "green space". There will be a one-day conference on green energy on August 25 at Stone Ridge Golf Club which might be good for someone from League to attend. Full information is available from the mayor's office. Finally, a representative from BG Parks & Recreation will be on WBGU-TV on Thursday August 18 at 8 p.m.
